## "Summer Jobs Project Heats Up"

Smart is currently partnering with California Department of Rehabilitation to provide Summer Work Experience job placements through the WIOA Young Adults pro-



gram (Youth Steps Grant). Young adults are referred to Smart by the DOR. The Smart Young Adult Staff, Betsey Ray, Supervisor, Sierra Blanco, and Sarah Ramos, as well as the Smart Business Service Representatives Tasha Van Dunk and Eric Olson have been busy meeting clients. Smart is assisting with career exploration, and

targeting appropriate and supportive work sites. Before being placed, young adults will have completed a series of work readiness classes to help them define goals. They have both short & long term employment goals, and short & long term educational goals. Many young adults also complete their GED before moving on to Work Experience work sites. This summer the young adults participated in Job Shadow Day where they learned about various positions at the Smart Center, and came prepared with several questions for staff. Work Experience sites include Wonder Metals Corp., Holiday Market, Petco, and Rite Aid. Other placements will be in hospitality, animal care, outdoor occupations, and other retail. Job coaching will be provided by both Smart and DOR.





#### **SHRM Conference**

On June 17-20, Betsey Ray, Smart Supervisor, Misty Bowman, Career Advisor, and Katrina Graves, Accounting Specialist, attended the SHRM Conference in Chicago, Illinois. ### **Smart Storm Project**

Smart Center continued to receive funds this quarter to assist public or private non-profit facilities affected by the storms of 2017-2018. Temporary jobs (4-5 months) include performing storm damage clean-up and repair. Three workers are currently at City of Redding, four at Western Shasta Resource Conservation District, and two at Mountain Gate Community Services District. Various CalTrans sites are using four people, and include HWY 299 E. of Redding, Burney area, and Lakehead/Gibson. One individual is at Anderson Cottonwood Irrigation District. Duties include repair to damaged trees, brush & vegetation repair and cleanup, asphalt highway shoulder repair, culvert repair, and repairing trails & fences. 
