"Grow Manufacturing Initiative"

The Smart Center sponsored the "Grow Manufacturing Initiative" luncheon conference on January 24 at the Redding Hilton Garden Inn, presented by Bill Gaines, Senior Engineer, Chairman of Transfer Flow Inc.

Mr. Gaines is a mechanical engineer and has owned a manufacturing company for over 44 years. He has long recognized the difficulties of working in the industry.

In 2013, he and other manufacturers formed a Grow Manufacturing Initiative (GMI) in Butte County, for the purpose of collaboration, and to develop e-commerce (B2B), training opportunities, and political clout; all to help strengthen the manufacturing workforce.

Additionally, Gaines' group,

works with educators to teach students coding and other manufacturing skills. He noted that in 2015 Butte Co. added 800 manufacturing jobs, which generated economic impact for the area. He was here in Redding to assist Shasta County in developing their unique consortium.

In addition to 8 manufacturers, approximately 35+ others showed up including educators and resource groups like Redding Chamber of Commerce, Shasta Builder's Exchange, and Economic Development Corp. of Shasta County. Debbie DeCoito, Executive Director of Smart, also assisted in coordinating the event.

Job Preparedness/Resource Fair 2017

The Job Preparedness Resources Fair was held on March 30, 2017 from 9am to 1pm at Win River Casino Event Center. Many job seekers who receive supportive assistance from Health and Human Services in Shasta County attend so they can prepare for the Smart & EDD Spring Job Fair being held the following week on April 6. The Resource Fair is open to the public.

The day is designed to assist job seekers by providing resume building tips, job application exercises, mock interviews, and advice on interview clothing. Professional haircuts are offered. Other community resources offered feedback on topics including record expungement.

Health & Human Services partnered with several agencies, including the Smart Business Resource Center, Department of Rehabilitation, CalWORKs, EDD, and others. Smart provided job search workshops and mock interviews for the clients, as well as information about the upcoming Job Fair.

According to EDD, the unemployment rate for Shasta County for February 2017 dropped to 7.1%, down from 7.4% in January.

60+ employers will meet with hundreds of job seekers who range in age, experience and expertise. Industries represented will be in retail, food service, health care, government, IT, recreation and hospitality, transportation, education, media and the military.


