Trinity Cradle to Career Partnership

Matthew Scrimiger, Trinity Smart Program Advisor attended the February meeting of Trinity Together-Cradle to Career Partnership. 60 local public agencies, schools, businesses, nonprofit organizations and individuals, are collaborating in promoting career opportunities for young people. The focus is matching interested high school students with local employers in a variety of career/employment sectors and to provide job shadowing opportunities. Seed money was provided by the McConnell Foundation, administered by the five-county coordinating organization North State Together. Program support and coordination is currently provided by the Watershed Research and Training Center in Hayfork. Smart provides support through our Young Adult program with opportunities for work experience and sponsorship for training. Young adults may get Shasta College credit while exploring potential career paths. Currently Trinity Together is recruiting for a Program Associate to lead additional initiatives that support youth, pre-K through 8th, in-school readiness assessments, and career exploration.




Shasta College Community Ed Classes Trinity County

The Smart Center provides pre-employment testing services to Trinity River Lumber Mill in Weaverville . This basic skills assessment (Test of Adult Basic Education or TABE) helps the employer understand how to best assess a potential employee and determine a fit in various positions in the company. The Smart Center provides this business service to employers as an important time saving, pre-screen & recruitment tool.



Whitewater Guide Training Exciting opportunity in Trinity County!

The Trinity Journal reported that on March 17-24, the Redwoods and Rivers Rafting conducted a Whitewater Guide School on the Trinity River and its tributaries. The program provided participants with the skills necessary to work as a professional river guide for commercial rafting outfitters or to safety guide their own private river trips. This is the 25th consecutive year that they have been providing whitewater guide training. Their school is recognized throughout the United States as one of the foremost in training guides and accredited by a state university. The class is approved for three units of credit through Humboldt State University's Office of Extended Education. There were also a limited number of "work exchange" scholarships available to local youth and low-income individuals. Future inquiries at 530-623-4627.
